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Clayton County Public Schools Selects New Finance/HR/Payroll System *Tyler Technologies' Munis System to Replace AS400 by Fall 2019*

JONESBORO – Clayton County Public Schools (CCPS) has selected a new Finance and Human Resources/Payroll system to operate more efficiently and effectively in the school system. Approved by the Clayton County Board of Education on June 6, 2017, CCPS has reached agreement with Tyler Technologies, Inc. to purchase the company's Munis enterprise resources planning (ERP) and ExecuTime Solutions System representing an investment of \$4.4 million. The new system will allow CCPS to better manage employee time and attendance, streamline the hiring process as well as expedite payroll processing thus allowing CCPS employees to receive semi-monthly compensation.

According to the Tyler Technologies website (www.tylertech.com), the Texas-based company is the largest software company in the nation solely focused on providing integrated software and technology services to the public sector. Tentatively scheduled to be fully implemented by the Fall of 2019, the new system will replace the currently used AS400 platform, which has been used for over twenty years. While supporting many of the district's critical financial, human resource, purchasing and payroll needs, the antiquated AS400 system requires many manual processes and lacks modern system capabilities, tools and user-friendly reporting functions which are needed to support current business operation.
