## WHAT IS TITLE I...

Title I, Part A is a federally funded program under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) that provides federal funds through the United States Department of Education to the Georgia Department of Education. Funds are then distributed to local educational districts and public schools with high percentages of economically disadvantaged children to help ensure that all children meet state academic achievement standards.

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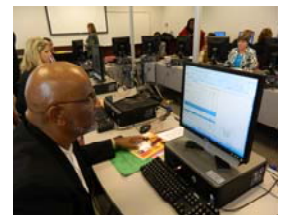

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### DEPARTMENTAL RESPONSIBILITIES

#### ♦ Title I Program Implementation

Technical assistance provided for successful implementation to include schoolwide programs, Title I Support, Academic Achievement Awards—Rewards Schools, Services to Eligible Private School Students, Tutorial Services to Neglected and Delinquent Students, Homeless students, School Improvement—Focus/Priority schools.

#### ♦ Migrant Services

Migrant services are available for eligible students.

#### ♦ Consolidated Application

Coordination of services for identified at-risk students. Required set-asides for homeless, Neglected & Delinquent, Parent Involvement, Professional Development, Private School Equitable Services, and Per Pupil Allocations.

#### ♦ Title Advisory Committee

The committee consists of parents, principals, budget personnel, accounting personnel. The group work together to discuss, develop, and review Title I programmatic needs for effective and efficient implementation.

#### ♦ Parental Involvement

All CCPS schools are Title I Schools, CCPS has 56 Parent Liaisons, all 63 schools have a Parent Resource Center with lending libraries. We are working to increase Parent Engagement in CCPS one parent at a time.

#### ♦ Monitoring of Programs

The Title I, Part A Program staff provides technical assistance, resources, and program monitoring to all district Title I schools to ensure that all children have an opportunity to obtain a high quality education and to achieve proficiency on high academic standards.
